

Figure 1. Texas Counties Reporting Arbovirus Activity, Week 39






Figure 3. Human Cases of West Nile Virus Reported in Texas, by MMWR Week of Onset, 2019-2021, Week 39 12 -10 -Number of Reported Cases **MMWR Week of Onset**
