DSHS further proposes new §157.123 concerning Regional Advisory Councils, §157.125 concerning Requirements for Trauma Facility Designation, and §157.130 concerning Funds for Emergency Medical Services, Trauma Facilities, and Trauma Care Systems, and the Designated Trauma Facility and Emergency Services Account. The proposed rules were published in the January 19, 2024, issue of the Texas Register (49 TexReg 199).

Handouts are limited to two pages of documentation (paper size: 8.5" by 11", one side only). Handouts must be emailed to DSHS by 5:00 PM, March 1, 2024, and include the name of the person commenting.
