- THMP will retain additional contract labor until it is clear we no longer need the additional labor to meet demand



State Fiscal Year (FY) September 1 – August 31 annually. Obligated funding is on a PO for the current FY.

Federal funds are on a federal fiscal year from April – March. Their funding amounts have been split to align with the state fiscal year but any funds remaining are rolled forward from FY2022 to FY2023.

The largest gain in the FY23 budget is due to rolling \$19M of Federal funds from FY22. Data as of 01/03/23
