## **Youth Camp Updates 2022**



#### **POOL RULES: House Bill 2205**

Texas Department of State Health Services

 From the 87<sup>th</sup> Legislature: House Bill 2205, effective September 1, 2021, amends Health and Safety Code (HSC) 341.0645 (Swimming Pools and Spas). The bill requires DSHS to adopt by reference the International Swimming Pool and Spa Code (ISPSC), except for Chapter 1 related to permitting and inspection, Chapter 7, Onground Storable Residential Swimming Pools, Chapter 8, Permanent Inground Residential Swimming Pools, Permanent Residential Spas and Permanent Residential Exercise Spas, and Chapter 10, Portable Residential Spas and Portable Residential Exercise Spas. The bill will require major amendment of the current Swimming Pool and Spa rules that are located at 25 TAC 265, Subchapter L. There will be a significant effect on safety requirements and enclosure requirements.

## Youth Camp Updates 2022



#### **POOL RULES: House Bill 2205**

Texas Department of State Health Services

- The Consumer Protection Division will begin the rule amendment process with the tentative aim of an effective date of January 1, 2023 for the new rules. Rule-writing activities will include:
- Posting of draft rules for informal comments and
- Posting of proposed rules in the Texas Register to allow for formal comments.

### Common inspection deficiencies

Criminal background checks. Minimum requirement for camps is to have a list of their employee roster that documents each on-site **adult** employee has passed a criminal background check.



Texas Department of State Health Services Sexual Abuse/ Molestation Awareness Training Certificates. Proof of each staff member's (adults and minors) training certificate must include the name of the course and approval number.

ie. S.A.M.T. - Stewards of Children YC11-



Criminal Background Checks vs.

Sexual Abuse & Molestation Awareness Training

- CriminalBackground Checks
  - Annual.
  - Only applies to adults.

- Sexual Abuse & Molestation Awareness Training
  - Every 2 years.
  - Applies to all employees or volunteers in a position involving contact with campers.
