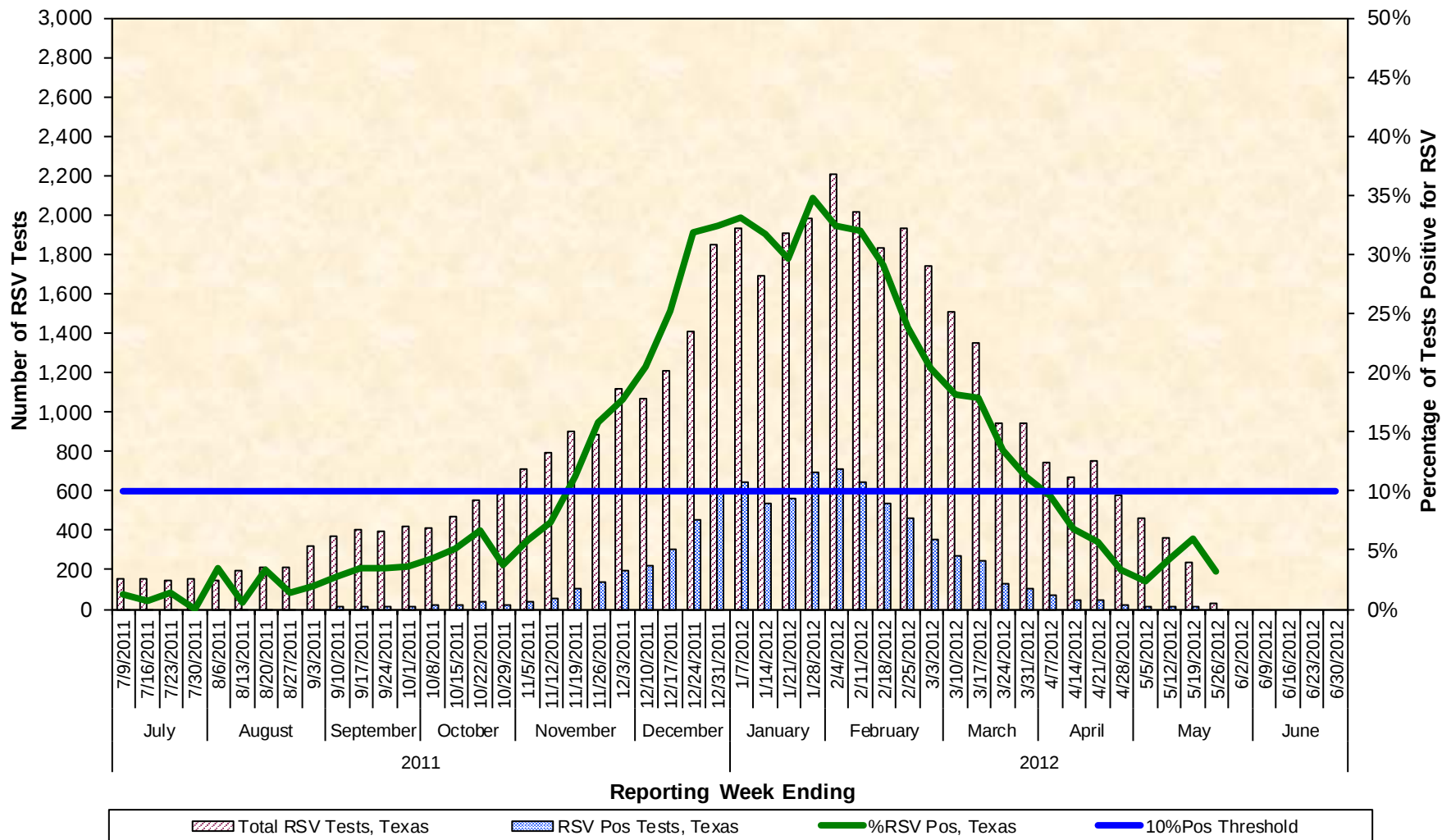
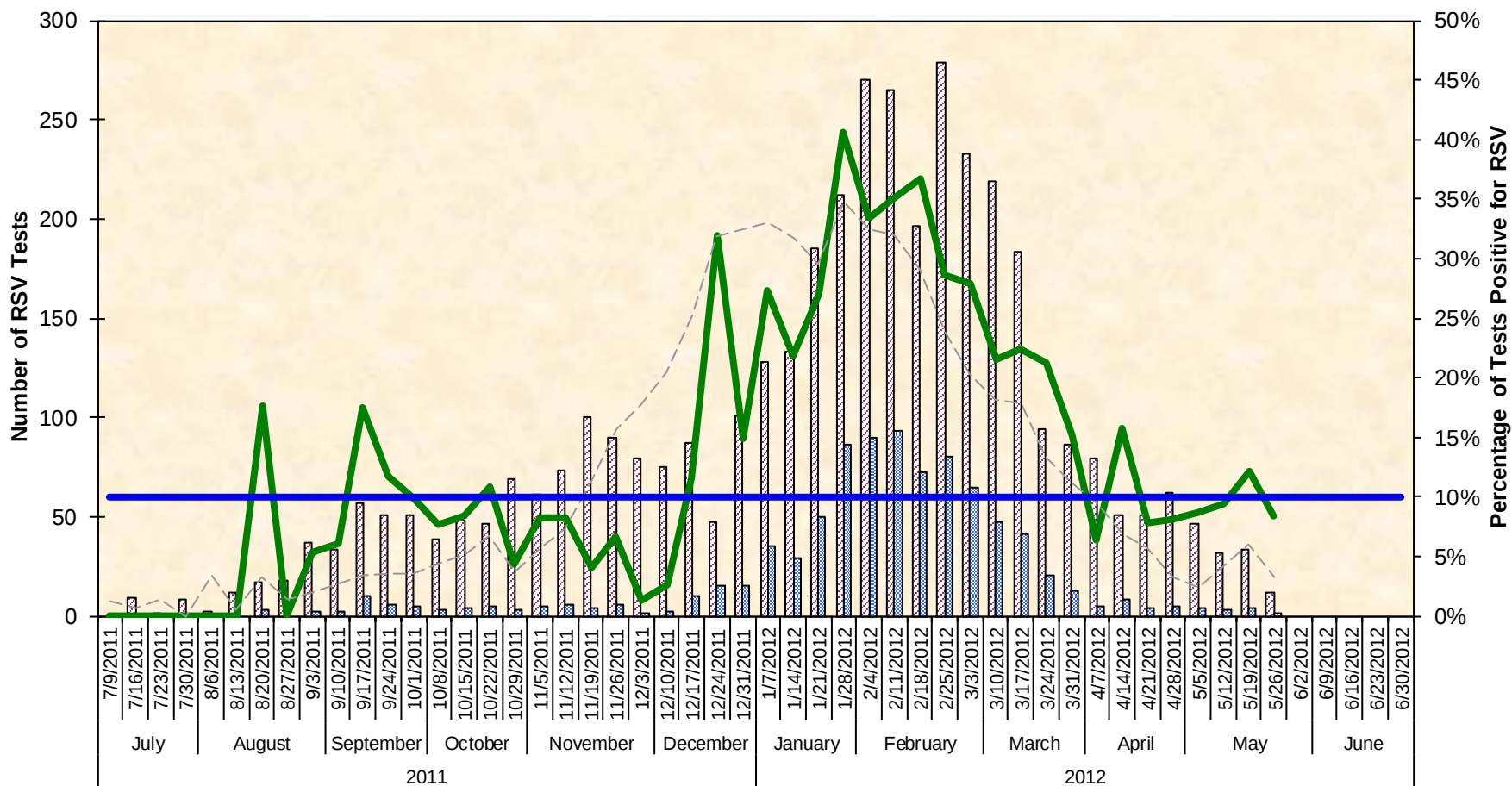


Number and Percentage of Antigen Tests Positive for Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) All Texas Sites, 2011–2012 Season

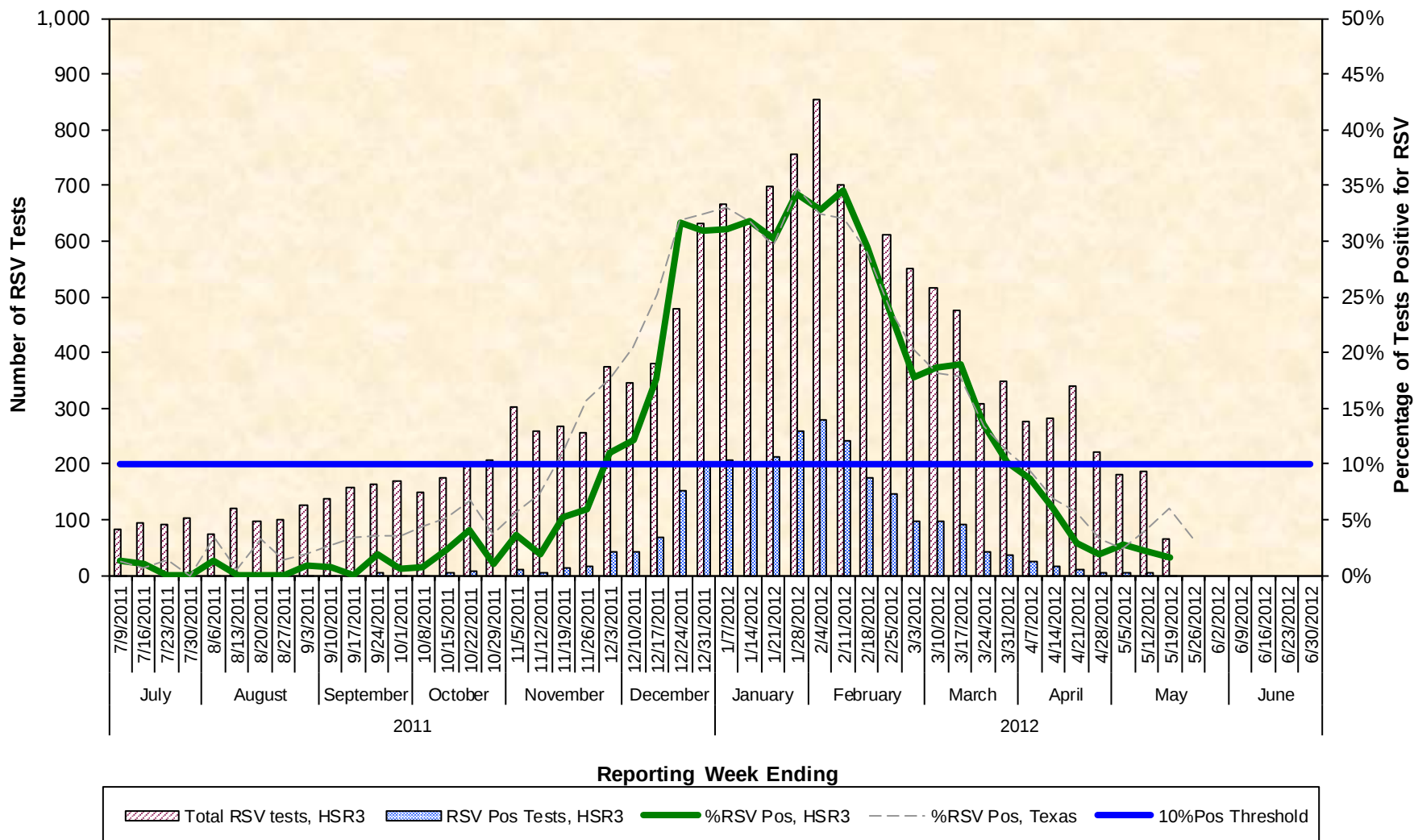

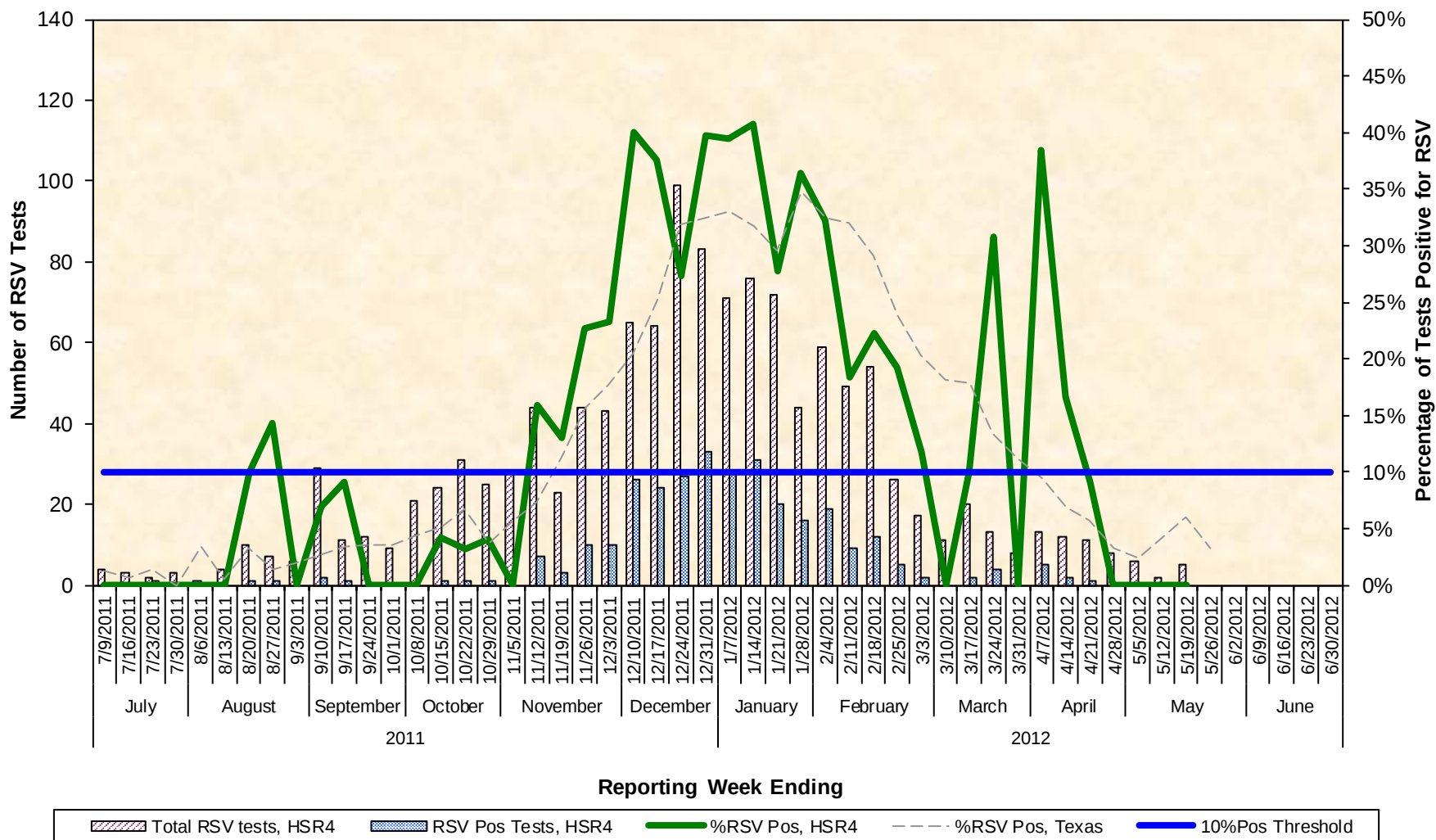

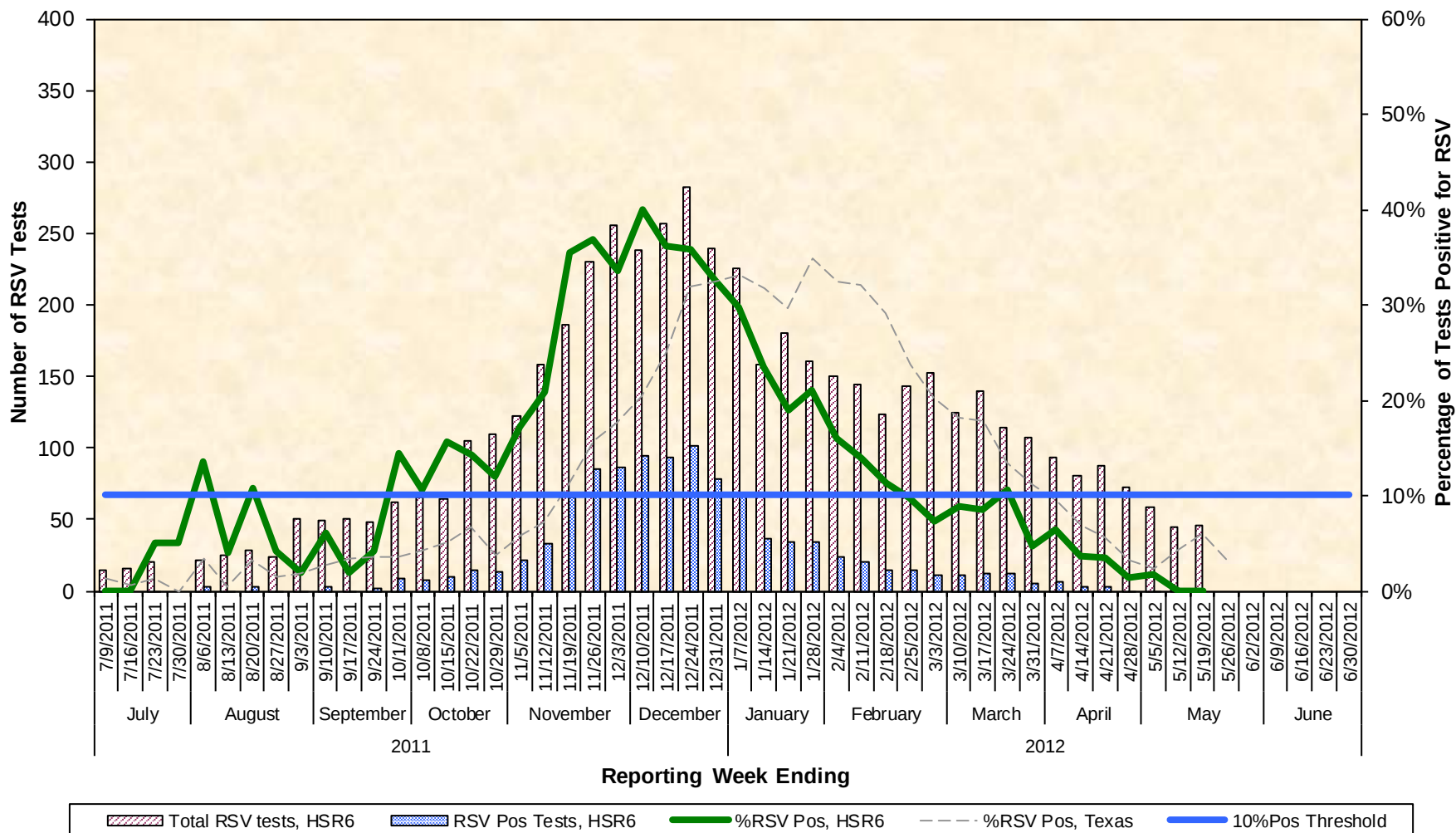

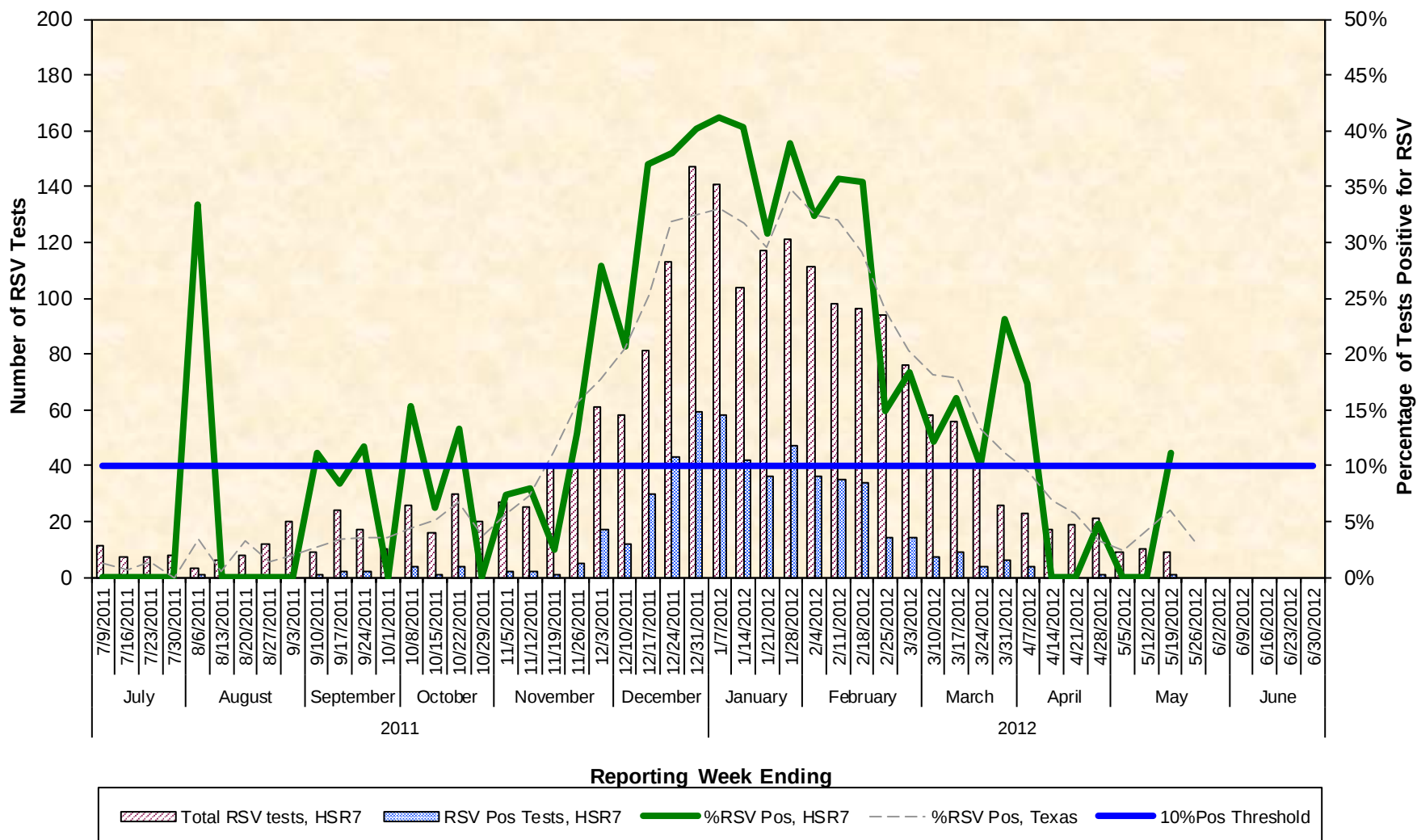

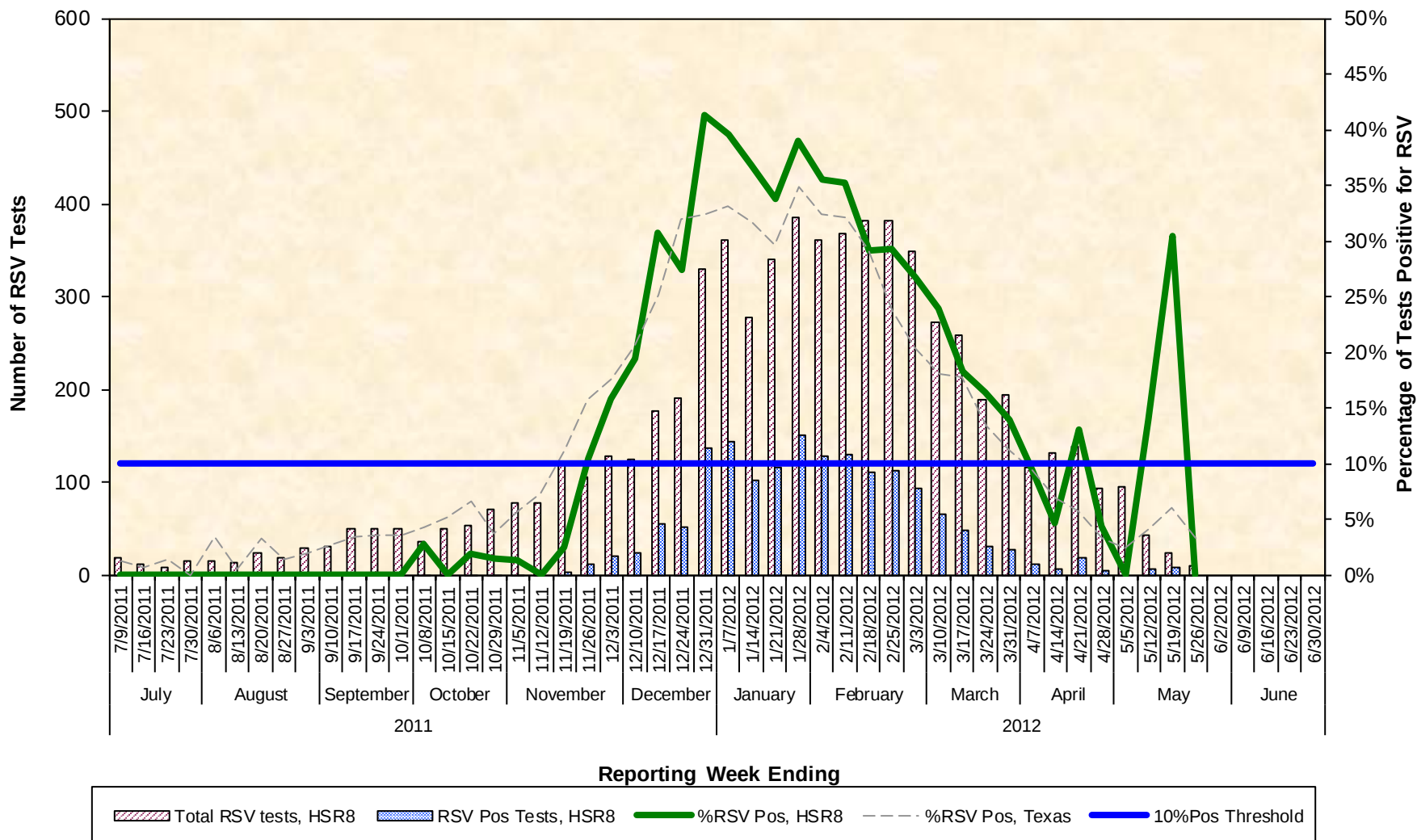

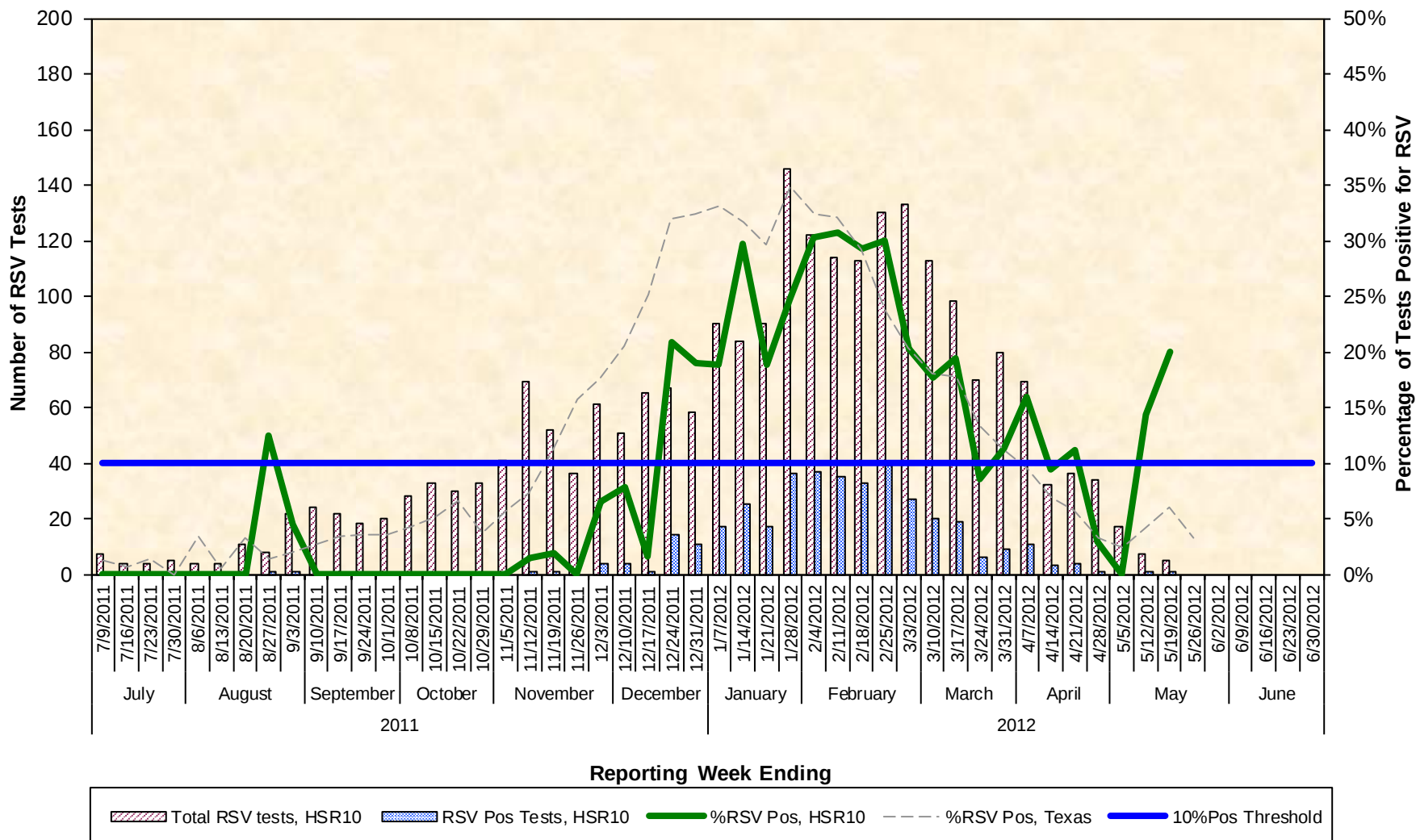
