TEXAS RADIATION ADVISORY BOARD FISCAL YEAR 2013 ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMISSIONER

This report summarizes the activities of the Texas Radiation Advisory Board (TRAB or Board) Fiscal Year (FY) 2013, September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2013, as required by 25 TAC §289.130(n).

The TRAB was created by the Texas Radiation Control Act pursuant to the Texas Health and Safety Code, Section 401.015. The Board normally consists of 18 members appointed by the Governor, consisting of subject matter experts in radiation and members of the public. The Board includes a chair, a vice-chair, and a secretary who are elected by and from the TRAB's membership. Members of the Board receive no compensation for their service, except for reimbursement for travel expenses incurred in attending meetings or for engaging in authorized Board business.

The TRAB is organized and directed to review and evaluate state radiation policies and programs; to make recommendations and furnish technical advice to the following state agencies:

- the Texas Department of State Health Service (DSHS)
- the Texas Commission of Environmental Quality (TCEQ)
- the Railroad Commission of Texas (RRC)

any other state agencies or groups that may be involved with radiation safety, such as the: Texas Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Compact Commission

The TRAB is to review proposed rules and guidelines of any state agency relating to the regulation of sources of radiation and to recommend changes in proposed or existing rules and guidelines relating to these issues.

Meetings

The TRAB is required, by statute, to meet at least quarterly, on dates set by the Board. Special meetings may be called by the TRAB Chairman or its committees, which consist of TRAB members. Board meetings may be held at any designated place in the state, determined by the Chairman to best serve the purpose for which the meeting is called. All meetings held during FY 2013 were held in Austin to minimize meeting expenses and to provide for the best use of staff resources from the various state agencies. The meetings held in FY 2013 are tabulated in Table 1:-TRAB Meetings.

Guidelines for Board Members

Those appointed to the TRAB may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting until they complete a training program. The DSHS provides members of the TRAB, information regarding the requirements for office, including information regarding a person's responsibilities under applicable laws relating to standards of conduct for state officers. Texas Government Code prohibits a state agency from attempting to influence a legislative measure, but allows a state agency or officer to provide factual information to a legislative body.

Board Actions in FY 2013

As required by statute, the TRAB reviewed and evaluated state radiation programs regulators and policies; and provided technical advice and made recommendations to the DSHS, TCEQ, and RRC.

The TRAB elected officers at their December 7, 2012 meeting. Ms. Amy Clark was elected Secretary, Dr. Nora Janjan as Vice Chair, and, Mr. John Hageman as Chair. Also, the TRAB established a new Topic Research Committee, which is tasked to identify and clarify specific issues that should be addressed by the TRAB and/or its Committees.

Resolutions and recommendations made during this time period were:

- The DSHS was asked to inform the TRAB of their proactive actions to prevent
 accidents in well logging and industrial radiography, due to their increased use in
 oil exploration, drilling, and production in Texas.
- The TRAB reviewed and recommended that TCEQ move forward in the rulemaking process for 30 TAC §336.227, Radioactive Tracers Used in the Exploration, Development or Production of Oil or Gas or Geothermal Resources."

- Formed and appointed officers and members to a new Topic Research Committee, which is tasked to identify radiation-protection topics that require review and action by the Board's Medical Committee or Industrial, Nuclear Power, Uranium and Waste Committee and the full Board, in order to further improve the State's radiation safety policies and regulations.
- The TRAB unanimously endorsed a resolution commending the DSHS and the TCEQ for the 50th anniversary of Texas being an Agreement State with the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission.
- The TRAB unanimously endorsed a resolution commending Ms. Alice Rogers' for her 30 years of service to the State of Texas.

Other activities for the TRAB were:

- Dr. Moreira provided a PowerPoint presentation on food irradiation.
- Mr. Harris presented a PowerPoint presentation on First Responders Emergency Response to radiological incidents.
- Mr. Lucas presented a PowerPoint presentation titled Nuclear Power Overview.
- Dr. Metter presented a PowerPoint presentation titled What is Nuclear Medicine?
- Mr. Free provided a PowerPoint presentation on incidents and overexposures related to oil and gas production.
- Mr. Free gave a PowerPoint presentation on emergency response.

Activities planned to be undertaken in FY 2014

The focus of the Board for FY 2014 will be on the following areas:

- Continued discussion and review of proposed radiation dose registries/diaries for medical patient exposures
- Continued discussion and review of linear accelerator issues regarding
 Stereotactic Body Radiation Therapy (SBRT)
- Review and comment on the potential storage and/or disposal of high-level nuclear waste in Texas.
- Review and comment on radioactive material releases from the Waste Isolation
 Pilot Plant (WIPP), used for disposal of transuranic radioactive material, in New Mexico.

- Review and comment on radioactive material security, especially related to the theft of a high-activity cobalt-60 source in Mexico.
- Review and comment on the potential for new nuclear power plants in Texas.
- Follow the incorporation of the most current American National Standards Institute
 (ANSI) standards Z136.1 to Z136.9, dealing with the Safe Use of Lasers in various
 facilities (e.g., medical facilities, research facilities, etc.) into the Texas
 regulations, 25 TAC §289.301, Registration and Radiation Safety Requirements
 for Lasers and Intense-Pulsed Light.
- TRAB's Medical Committee will continue to review and comment on any regulations dealing with radiation used in the healing arts.
- TRAB's Industrial, Nuclear Power, Uranium and Waste Committee will continue
 to review and comment on regulations and policies within their scope. Emphasis
 will especially be on assurance that nuclear reactors, radioactive waste disposals,
 and drinking water supplies remains as safe is as reasonably possible for the State
 of Texas.
- Work with the Governor's office to renew or replace Board members with expired or expiring appointment terms.
