Programmatic News Flash

1. Ryan White to cover Standalone dental insurance premiums – as of April 1, 2017

The HIV/AIDS Bureau (HAB) has updated Policy Clarification Notice (PCN) #16-02 Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Services: *Eligible Individuals and Allowable Uses of Funds* to include the use of RWHAP resources to support standalone dental insurance premiums and/or cost sharing assistance under the Health Insurance Premiums and Cost Sharing Assistance for Low-Income Individuals service category.

Key Updates on Revision

The revised Health Insurance Premiums and Cost Sharing Assistance for Low-Income Individuals service provision consists of the following:

- Paying health insurance premiums to provide comprehensive HIV Outpatient/ Ambulatory Health Services and pharmacy benefits that provide a full range of HIV medications; and/or
- Paying standalone dental insurance premiums to provide comprehensive oral health care services for eligible clients; and/or
- Paying cost sharing on behalf of the client.

Other Updates to PCN #16-02

- Removes the prohibition on RWHAP Parts C and D recipients to use RWHAP funds for Substance Abuse Services (residential);
- Clarifies how RWHAP funds can be used for provider transportation in the Program Guidance for Medical Transportation;
- Provides additional Program Guidance for RWHAP Parts A, C, and D recipients related to AIDS Drug Assistance Program Treatments;
- Adds a section describing updates; and
- Organizes the service categories in alphabetical order for easier reference.

2. Clarification on overtime pay for data entry

No additional funding will be made available to cover the cost of overtime pay for providers doing data entry. Though it is understood that providers are working on assigned times to complete data entry, it is highly encouraged for providers to flex their schedules as much as possible. Additionally, the time for data entry is not to be included in the 10% admin cap. Please refer to HRSA PCN 15-01 on the detailed clarification over this topic. To summarize the PCN, costs can be covered under the direct services that the provider is funded for. A letter that serves as prior approval was provided to the AA's at the end of November 2016.

4. Hepatitis vaccination and refrigeration guidance

When you vaccinate for Hep A/B you need to do a post vaccination titer about 1 to 2 month later.

- The CDC states that no provider who purchases vaccine with federal funds can use a dormitory refrigerator. Agencies can use their supplemental or OAHS funds to purchase an appropriate refrigerator. Contact DSHS for some guidance.
