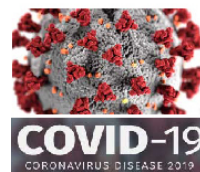

Greenlighting Co-Administration

Co-administration of all recommended vaccines is vital to increase the probability for individuals to be fully vaccinated at the appropriate time and age - especially when a health care provider is uncertain that a patient will return for additional vaccines.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the COVID-19 vaccine can be administered with other recommended vaccines without regard to timing. This means that influenza and COVID-19 vaccines can be administered at the same visit and in doing so, will work to reduce illness, hospitalizations, and deaths.
