#### 2008 - 2009 Texas Influenza Surveillance Information

### Influenza Surveillance Report for MMWR Week 47

The influenza (flu) activity level for Texas for the week ending November 22, 2008 was "sporadic." Sporadic activity indicates that isolated reports of lab-confirmed influenza along with influenza-like illness have been reported. During week 47, nineteen (3.6%) specimens tested by NREVSS laboratories in Texas were positive for influenza. The percentage of visits for influenza-like illness as reported by ILINet providers in Texas was below the regional baseline. Flu is occurring in the state at a very low level.

#### **Reports from Health Service Regions**

Reports were received from all Health Service Regions (HSRs) for week 47. HSR 1 reported a decrease in flu activity compared to week 46; HSRs 2/3 and 4/5N reported an increase in flu activity compared to week 46. #### **Laboratory Results**

During week 47, nine hospital laboratories and public health agencies across Texas reported conducting a total of 529 influenza tests (antigen, culture, and PCR) to the National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS of sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Of the 424 antigen detection tests that were performed, eight were positive for influenza A/not subtyped and four were positive for influenza B. The positive results were reported from Bell and Nueces counties. No positive PCR results were reported. A total of nine reports of culture-confirmed influenza were received for the following counties:



## U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network


Forty-four sentinel providers in Texas reported data to the U.S. Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet) (formerly known as the U.S. Influenza Sentinel Provider Surveillance System) on patients with influenza-like illness (ILI) and total patients seen for any reason during week 47. Sixteen (36%) of these providers saw at least one patient with ILI. Of all patient visits during this week, 1.95% were due to ILI. The ILI baseline for the West South Central Region (Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas) of the United States is 4.8% for the 2008-2009 season. The baseline is the mean percentage of patient visits for ILI during non-influenza weeks for the previous three seasons plus two standard deviations.







# **National Influenza Activity Map**
