2017 Annual Tuberculosis Screening Report

Tuberculosis and Hansen's Disease Branch





In 2017, a total of 9,093 new tuberculosis (TB) cases were reported in the Unites States (U.S.), representing an incidence rate of 2.8 cases per 100,000 persons. In comparison, Texas reported a total of 1,127 TB cases in 2017, a rate of 4.5 per 100,000 persons.

As has been the case for the past decade, four states (California, Florida, New York, and Texas) reported half of the total TB cases in the United States in 2017.

Among Texas TB cases, 8.3% were confined in a correctional facility at the time of diagnosis. In comparison, 3% of all TB cases in the U.S. were incarcerated at the time of diagnosis. In Texas, the correctional case count decreased by 35% from 2016 to 2017, and the proportion declined by 2.9% over the same period.
