Emergency Medical Services Personnel Growth Trends

This fact sheet is an overview of the trends, distribution, and demographics of emergency medical services (EMS) personnel in Texas. In 2020, there were 67,180 actively licensed EMS personnel in Texas.

- This number represented a 9.5% increase since 2015 and a 19.1% increase since 2010.
- Relative to population growth, the size of the EMS workforce has improved by 1.8% over the past 10 years.

Figure 1. Total EMS Personnel





Figure 2. Ratio of Population to EMS Personnel

Figure 3. Ratio of Texas Population to EMS Personnel by County



EMS personnel were fairly evenly distributed throughout border and non-border counties, but not metropolitan and non-metropolitan counties.


- Per capita, non-metropolitan counties had 1.3 times as many EMS personnel as metropolitan counties.
- Per capita, non-border counties had 1.1 times as many EMS personnel as border counties.

Demographics of Emergency Medical Services Personnel

Race/Ethnicity of EMS Personnel

Black/African American and Hispanic/Latino EMS personnel were underrepresented when compared to the Texas population.¹


Figure 4. Race/Ethnicity of Texas Population and EMS Personnel



Age Distribution of EMS Personnel by Race/Ethnicity

- 6.8% of white/Caucasian EMS personnel were 61 years of age or over, while 52.6% were aged 40 years or under.
- 28.4% of black/African American EMS personnel were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 54.2% were aged 40 years or under.
- 21.2% of Hispanic/Latino EMS personnel were between 41 and 50 years of age, and 68.3% were aged 40 years or under.

Gender of EMS Personnel

- In 2020, 24.5% of EMS personnel were female and 75.5% were male.²
- Among EMS personnel aged 40 years or under in 2020, 26.4% were female and 73.6% were male.

Age Distribution of EMS Personnel by Gender

Within 10 years, 11.4% of the current Texas EMS workforce will be over 65 years of age.³

- 27.9% of all EMS personnel were 30 years of age or under.
- 2.0% of active EMS personnel in Texas were over 65 years of age in 2020.
- Among EMS personnel over 55 years of age, males comprised 76.7% of the EMS workforce.

Figure 6. License type


