Detoxification

Detoxification Program

- 25 Beds for men and women
- Medical Interventions for Withdrawal Symptoms from Substance Abuse
 - Primary Admissions:
 - Opioids Heroin, Illegal Prescription Drugs
 - Alcohol Life threatening seizure precautions
 - Multidrug combinations benzodiazepines +++
 - Methamphetamines on the rise again
- Typical Stay, 4 to 6 Days
- Can initiate MAT at this point
- Peer Engagement to Determine Motivation to Change

Men's Residential Program

- 24 Bed Unit
- 28 60 Day Stay
- Average Age: 34-36
- Years of Drug Use: 14
- Prevalent Substances:
 - Opioids
 - Alcohol
 - Polydrug Involvement
- Specialty Services:
 - Parenting Classes
 - HIV/ STI Testing and Resources



Women's Residential

Women's Residential Program

- 19 Bed Unit
- 28 90 Day Stay
- Average Age: 32
- Years of Drug Use: 8+
- CPS Involvement: 40+%
- Substances:
 - Opioids/Heroin
 - Alcohol
 - Benzodiazepines
- Specialty Services:
 - Domestic Violence
 - Women's Health
 - HIV/ STI Testing and Resources
 - Parenting Classes

- The Colony (NFM)
- Current Roster = 218
- Intake Monday-Friday
- Flexible Access
 - Groups:
 - M-F 9-12:00 or 6-9:00
 - Family Program Saturday

- Continuing Care
 - Group and Individual Counseling
 - SUD Education
 - Medication Assisted Treatment Available
 - Screening and Connection to Local Health Care/HIV Service Providers
 - Employment or Vocational Guidance

Recovery Support

<u>SUD Recovery Support</u> <u>Services (RSS)</u>

- 314 Participants
- 10 Recovery Coaches embedded in the Residential and Outpatient programs
- Engagement and Encouragement from Inquiry to Intake and transitioning between Levels of Care

 - Alumni Meetings and Events
 - Direct Connection to Community Resources
 - Drivers License
 - Birth Certificate
 - Employment or Vocational Support – Clothes, Tools

Crisis Residential

Psychiatric Crisis Residential

- 18-bed unit for men, women, and transgender
- Average Length of Stay: 7 days
- Goal: Stabilize and Connect
- Simultaneous treatment for Mental Health and Detoxification needs
- Psychiatric Medication Stabilization & Management
- Visitation for family/support system
- <u>2019 Admissions = 888</u>
 - Schizophrenia Schizo-Affective
 - Depression Suicidal
 - **BiPolar Mania**
 - Drug-Induced Psychosis

CMHP

<u>CMHP – Comprehensive</u> <u>Mental Health Program</u>

- Outpatient currently located at 5300 University Hills
- Soon expanding to 315 Sunset
- Medication Management
- Therapy
- Case management
- Served 245 consumers from October-December 2019 (143 unduplicated)



Peer Support

Mental Health Peer Support

- Persons with "Lived Experience"
- Served 233 peers from October-December 2019
- Assistance with:
 - Medication management
 - Housing
 - Birth certificate, social security card, driver's license
 - Group facilitation
 - Encouragement
 - Life skills development
 - Service to peers in Homeward Bound's programs
 - Service to peers who are in other NTBHA-funded programs



• Statewide Residential

- 16-bed unit for men, women, and transgender clients
- 60-day length of stay

• Achievement Measures

- To get people newly diagnosed or out of healthcare 6+ months, on HIV medications, a balanced diet, engaged with health services and Case Management Services
- People currently in care to become medication compliant, keep all of their medical appointments and try to reach a virally suppressed status by time of discharge

- Admission Criteria:
- Labs taken within the past 90 days showing
 - ✓ Viral Load
 - ✓ CD4 Count
 - ✓ Chem-20 Panel
 - ✓ CBC
 - ✓ TB Test Results *We can test on site if needed
- Must pass medical assessment at time of intake

Program Objectives

- <u>Facilitate self-care</u> accomplished through the combination of three major components:
 - Client Education
 - Client Counseling
 - Self-help Facilitation
- <u>Service Enrollment</u>
 - Connecting clients with HIV care

- Motivational Interviewing, CBT
- Seeking Safety
- Medication Assisted Treatment
- HIV/STI Education, Testing, and Resources
- Medical and Psychiatric Referral
- 12 Step and Faith-Based Support
- Alternative Recovery Programs
- Community Resources
- Recovery and Peer Specialist
 Support

- Discharge Approach
 - Sober & Drug Free Housing in Home Community
 - Continuing Care through Outpatient Counseling
 - Peer Recovery Activities
 - Connection to Local Health Care/HIV Service Providers
 - Employment or Vocational Opportunities
 - Clothing Assistance
 - Family Communication and/or Reunification
