



COVID-19 Vaccine Pediatric

Moderna: 6 months – 5 years


Pfizer: 6 months – 4 years

COVID-19 Vaccines for Pediatric Pop *6 months – 4/5 years*

- Both Moderna and Pfizer are in the going through the regulatory process with the FDA for their respective COVID-19 vaccine in 6 months – 4/5 years of age
 - Moderna COVID-19 vaccine will be for 6 months 5 years
 - Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine will be for 6 months 4 years
- Both manufacturers have a different vaccine products than their current vaccine products in-use
 - Moderna COVID-19 vaccine blue cap vial
 - 0.25 mL/25 mcg per dose
 - 2-dose primary series, @28 days apart
 - Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine maroon cap vial
 - 0.2 mL after dilution (3 mcg per dose)
 - 3-dose primary series, @dose intervals?

School-based Health Centers (SBHCs)

These clinics provide primary healthcare and other services to students in kindergarten through 12th grade.

SBHCs serve schools and communities in rural and frontier areas and help to overcome geographical barriers and lack of access to care, including vaccination efforts.

Implementation of SBHCs improves health equity and addresses social determinants of health, especially in rural and frontier areas.

How Can Schools and Daycares Support COVID-19 Vaccination




6 Ways To Promote COVID-19 Vaccines

- 1. Set up a COVID-19 vaccination clinic at your school.
- 2. Partner up on COVID-19 vaccine-related activities in your community.
- 3. Arm school staff with resources for answering general COVID-19 vaccination questions.
- 4. Promote vaccine confidence among students, parents, and guardians.
- 5. Promote well-child visits for routine health needs.
- 6. Make COVID-19 a teachable moment.

Hosting a School Located Vaccine Clinic (SLV)

While children in the United States are vaccinated primarily in their pediatrician's or family doctor's office, schools provide unique opportunities for getting children vaccinated:

- •Children are already present in schools and daycares
- •SLV can be more convenient for parents and guardians (referred to from this point on as parents)
- •SLV can be used to administer COVID-19 vaccine rapidly and efficiently to eligible students and possibly their family members, teachers, school staff, and others in the community
- •SLV can be used to offer routine vaccinations and catch-up vaccinations for students behind in vaccination because of the pandemic
- •SLV is often used for yearly influenza vaccination

Benefits of Being a COVID-19 Vaccine Provider



COVID-19 Vaccine Program is designed to distribute COVID-19 Vaccines to providers who are interested in supplying this medication to their patients.



The program also serves to work with and educate providers on how to safely store vaccines and to give them personalized guidance on vaccine storage and handling.

Why Enroll?

Benefits of Being a COVID-19 Provider





Vaccine administration continues to be one of the best recommended precautions to mitigate the risk of hospitalization and death in individuals. We encourage providers to enroll in this program so that they can receive vaccines to help protect their patients.



Free of Charge

Providers who enroll in the COVID-19 Vaccine Program will be able to receive vaccine from the Department of State Health Services free of charge.



Most Efficient

As COVID-19 Vaccines are still not available for private purchase, programs such as ours are the most efficient way to receive these vaccines.





Enroll to request COVID-19 Vaccine

In order to receive COVID-19 vaccine, you must enroll with Texas DSHS.

You will need to provide the following information to complete enrollment.

- · Confirm location and shipping address
- Provide days and times of the week when shipments of vaccine can be received.
- PLEASE NOTE: You MUST HAVE at least one (1) day other than a Monday, which has a four (4) hour designated window for delivery of your vaccine shipment. For example: Thursday 8am to 12pm.

Proof of Vaccine Storage Capacity (On site refrigeration and freezer storage units)

Information needed for each storage unit:

- · Storage Unit Location (within the facility)
- Brand and Model
- Storage Capacity (cubic feet)
- Use [Primary, Backup/Overflow, Day Use]
- Refrigerator Type [Under the counter (freezerless), Standalone (freezerless), Combination (Single Control), Combination (Dual Control), Other]
- Refrigerator Grade [Household, Commercial, Medical/Laboratory/Pharmaceutical]
- Freezer Type [Standalone Upright, Standalone Chest, Combination (Single Control), Combination (Dual Control), Other]
- Freezer Grade [Household, Commercial, Medical/Laboratory/Pharmaceutical]

Needed Data Logger Information (for refrigerators, freezer and backup freezer data logger)

- Data Logger Type [Built-In, Digital Data Logger (WIFI), Digital Data Logger (Wired), Other]
- Brand and Model
- Serial Numbe
- Calibration Expiration Date [Proof for each Data Logger of a calibration certificate not expiring within 60 days of submitting
 your enrollment request.]
- . Copy of the data logger certificate to upload into the enrollment form.







- ✓ Approval
- ✓ If any of this information is incomplete, your enrollment will be "unlocked" until the information is correct/provided and resolved.



Report COVID-19 Vaccines Daily to ImmTrac2

Reminder

- The Texas Immunization Registry, known as ImmTrac2, safely consolidates and stores immunization records from multiple sources in one centralized system.
- Reporting administered vaccines in ImmTrac2 promptly ensures that the state receives accurate quantities of CDC-allocated vaccine. Providers should report COVID-19 vaccines within 24 hours of administration and all other administered vaccines within 30 days of administration.

Using Reminder/Recall System

Reminder/Recall Report Tool

The Reminder/Recall Report generates client notices, which includes letters, cards, mailing labels, and client listings. Reminder and recall notices can be generated for each client if the following conditions in the client record are met:

- ✓ The client status is "Active" in the Client Information section for your organization.
- ✓ The "Allow Reminder and Recall Contact?" indicator in the Client Information section is "Yes."
- ✓ The client has complete address information listed in the Address Information section.

Providers can utilize the Reminder/Recall to help patients follow through in receiving their second dose of COVID-19 vaccine in a timely manner.

 Pediatric patients (except the uninsured) have a source of billing, including Medicaid population at a rate of \$40/dose.



10 Easy Steps to Becoming a **COVID-19 Vaccine Provider**







- 3. Provide times of day during the week when vaccines can be delivered to your facility. Providers enrolled in VFC may use their current delivery times.
- 4. Ensure your facility has the capability of storing COVID-19 vaccines by providing information for the vaccine storage unit(s) at your facility.
 - Upload data logger calibration certificates.
- Input the prescribing providers information.
- Identify your patient population.
- 7. Report where you will administer the COVID-19 vaccine (clinic, offsite, childcare facility, etc.)
- 8. Identify your facility's Chief Medical Officer (CMO) and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) & have them sign the form
- 9. Wait for approval from TX Department of State Health Services
- 10. Place orders for COVID-19 vaccines in Vaccine Allocation & Ordering System (VAOS)

Waste Disposal and Reporting Resources

While it is important to try to use every dose of vaccine possible, that should not be at the expense of missing an opportunity to vaccinate every eligible person when they are ready to get vaccinated.

COVID-19 VACCINE DISPOSAL GUIDELINES

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that COVID-19 vaccines should be treated as regulated medical waste in its disposal requirements from their <u>Identification</u> <u>Disposal</u>, and <u>Reporting of COVID-19 Vaccine Wastage</u> notice. The CDC advises providers to waste COVID-19 vaccines in accordance with local regulations. For guidance on reporting Moderna doses wasted, see the following guide:
