Vision, Hearing, and Spinal Screening Reporting Period Open

The <u>Vision, Hearing and Spinal Screening (VHSS) Reporting</u> period began on January 15, 2024. Report results are required to be submitted to the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) online through the <u>Child Health Reporting System</u> (<u>CHRS</u>) by June 30th of each year. The last day to submit your report for this school year is June 30, 2024. After June 30th, the reporting system will shut down and late reporting cannot be submitted. TAAIS Memorial Foundation Asthma Scholarship Award

The <u>Texas Allergy</u>, <u>Asthma and Immunology Society</u> (<u>TAAIS</u>) Memorial Foundation is pleased to announce the <u>2024 TAAIS Memorial Foundation Asthma Scholarship</u> <u>Award</u>. This \$3,000 one-time award will be granted to up to five qualified high school seniors in Texas who suffer from Asthma. Applications are due on March 1, 2024.

GroMoreGood Grassroots Grant

The <u>Scotts Miracle-Gro</u> Foundation and <u>KidsGardening</u> are accepting applications for the GroMoreGood Grassroots Grant. The grant is designed to bring gardens to communities across the United States. Any nonprofit organization, school district, university, or tax-exempt organization with at least 15 youth participating in the program is eligible to apply. Awards will be awarded to 170 programs to start or expand their youth garden or greenspace. A total of \$100,000 will be awarded. Trauma-Informed Care Workshop for Educators

The <u>Texas School Safety Center</u> is hosting virtual training for Trauma Informed Care throughout Spring of 2024. Attendees will learn about the role of mental health in daily functioning, how trauma impacts the brain, the importance of unrecognized executive function deficits, and the role neuro diverse difficulties play in student

Free Lead Testing in Schools and Child Care Facilities

The <u>Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ)</u>'s <u>Lead Testing in School</u> and <u>Child Care (LTSCC) Program</u> is a voluntary statewide program that offers free lead testing to public schools and regulated childcare facilities. The program's goal is to help reduce childhood exposure to lead in drinking water. Water sample kits are provided to all enrolled schools, and every water outlet that children use for drinking, teeth brushing, or food preparation at no cost. Support is available if elevated lead levels are detected.
