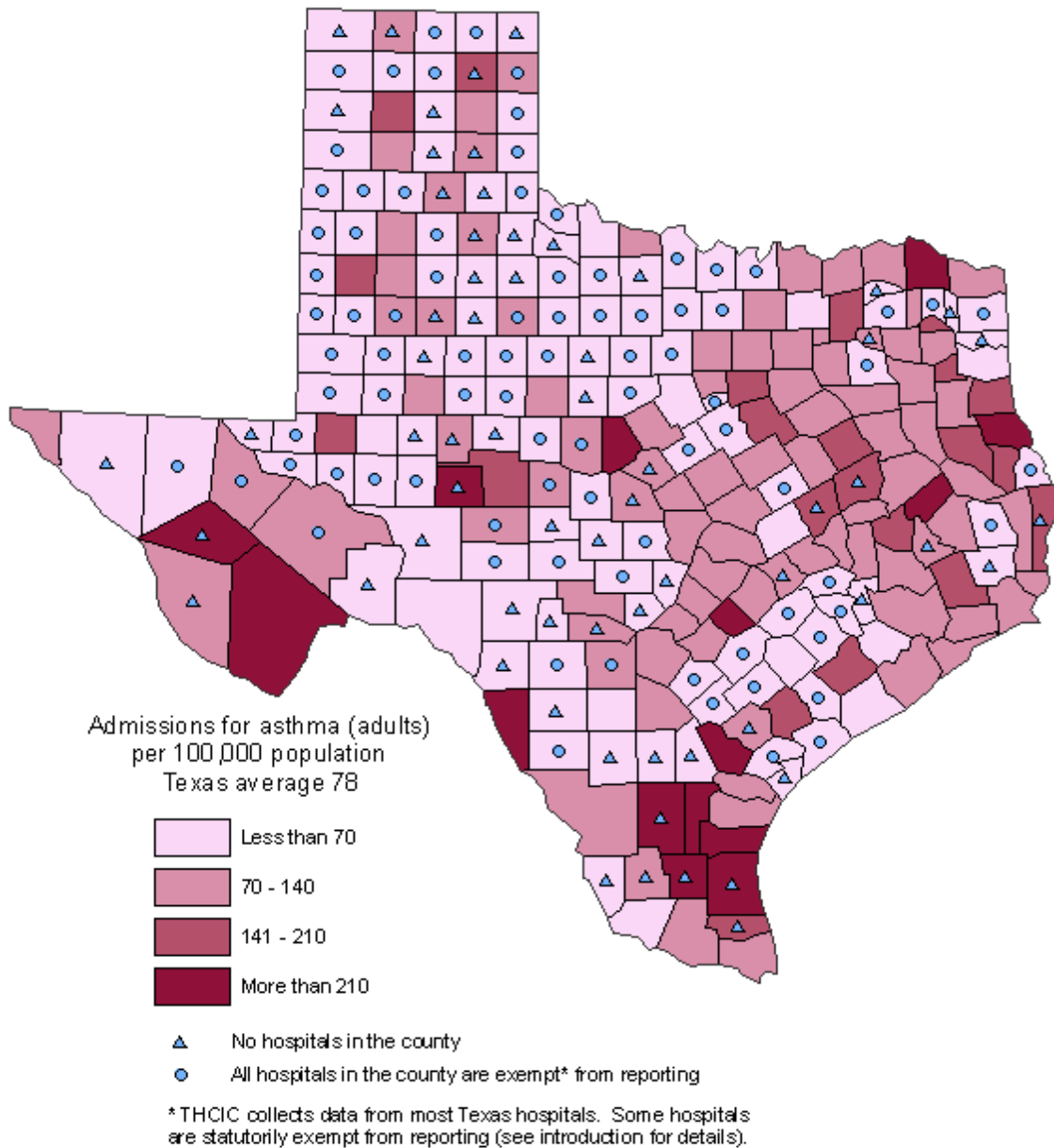


## 10. Adult asthma

Asthma is a chronic condition that occurs when the main air passages of the lungs become inflamed and narrowed and breathing becomes difficult. Asthma symptoms can range from mild to very severe and include coughing, wheezing, and in severe cases, gasping for air. Asthma is treatable, and most flare-ups and deaths can be prevented through the use of medications. Asthma “flares” (also called attacks) actually develop over time, involving a complicated process of increasing airway obstruction. With the help of their doctors, many people with asthma have learned to recognize their own particular warning signs of asthma attacks. Treating symptoms early can result in prevented or less severe attacks.
